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TREATMENT PLANT AT MAGADI TOWNSHIP FOR TATA
CHEMICALS LIMITED IN KAJIADO COUNTY

INVITATION OF PUBLIC COMMENTS

Pursuant to Regulation 21 of the Environmental Management and Co-ordination (Impact Assessment and Audit) Regulations, 2003, the National Environment Management Authority (NEMA) has received an Environmental Impact Assessment Study Report for the above proposed project.

The proponent, Tata Chemicals Magadi Limited, is proposing to establish a domestic wastewater treatment plant at Magadi Township in Kajiado County. The plant will comprise of three main components: wastewater collection network, pumped waste water reticulation network, waste water treatment plant and recycled water distribution network.

The following are the anticipated impacts and proposed mitigation measures:

Excessive noise and vibration	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Sensitize construction vehicle drivers and machinery operators to switch off engines of vehicles or machinery not being used. Sensitize construction drivers to avoid gunning of vehicle engines or unnecessary hooting especially when passing through sensitive areas such as churches, residential area and apartment. Ensure that construction machinery are kept in good condition to reduce noise generation. Ensure that all generators and heavy duty equipment are insulated or placed in enclosures to minimize ambient noise levels. The noisy construction works will entirely be planned to be during day time when most of the neighbours will be at work.
Increased solid waste generation	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Use of an integrated solid waste management system i.e. through a hierarchy of options: Source reduction, recycling, composting and reuse, combustion, sanitary land filling. Through accurate estimation of the sizes and quantities of materials required, order materials in the sizes and quantities they will be needed, rather than cutting them to size, or having large quantities of residual materials. Ensure that construction materials left over at the end of construction will be used in other projects rather than being disposed off. Ensure that damaged or wasted construction materials including cabinets doors,

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> plumbing and lighting fixtures, marbles and glass will be recovered for refurbishing and use in other projects. Donate recyclable/reusable or residual materials to local community groups, institutions and individual local residents or home owners. Use building materials that have minimal or no packaging to avoid the generation of excessive packaging waste.

IN EXERCISE of powers conferred by Articles 84, 85, 88(4), 88 (4) 177 (1) (a) and 194 (1) (a) and (c) of the Constitution of Kenya, sections 2, 5 (b), 13 (3), 19, 25, 32, 38, 43 (5A) and 74 of the Elections Act, 2011 and Regulations 11(6), 12 (1) and (4) (c), 13, 13B, 14 and 15, Parts VIII and IX of the Election (General) Regulations, 2012, the Independent Electoral and Boundaries Commission gives notice that:

- (a) Following the declaration of vacancy in the offices of Abakaile, Ganda, Loiyangalani and Mutonguni Wards *vide* letters from the respective County Assembly Speakers dated 1st March, 2019, 8th May, 2019, 8th May, 2019 and 12th June, 2019, respectively, there shall be by-elections for Members of the said County Assembly Wards on Thursday, 17th October, 2019.
- (b) Each political party intending to participate in the by-elections shall submit the names of the persons contesting in a party primary and the date of the party primary on or before Monday, 29th July, 2019.
- (c) A public officer who intends to contest in the said by-elections shall have resigned from public office within seven (7) days of the declaration of the said vacancies being 8th March, 2019, 15th May, 2019, 15th May, 2019 and 19th June, 2019 for Abakaile, Ganda, Mutonguni and Loiyangalani wards, respectively.
- (d) The Commission shall publish, in the *Gazette*, the names of the persons contesting in a party primary and the date of the party primary within seven (7) days of receipt of the names of the candidates.
- (e) Candidates intending to participate in the by-elections as independent candidates shall not have been members of any political party at least three months immediately before the date of the by-elections.
- (f) Political parties intending to present candidates in this election shall, after its primaries resolve all intra-party disputes and submit the list of persons nominated to contest in this election to the Commission on or before the Tuesday, 13th August, 2019.
- (g) Candidates intending to participate in this election as independent candidates shall submit their names and symbols that they intend to use during the by-elections for purposes of nomination of independent candidates to the Commission on or before Monday, 29th July, 2019.
- (h) The Commission shall publish in the *Gazette*, the names and symbols of persons intending to contest in the election as independent candidates at least fourteen (14) days before the nomination day.
- (i) The days for the nomination of political party candidates and independent candidates for the by-elections shall be on

Monday, 19th August, 2019 and Tuesday, 20th August, 2019 and the nomination papers shall be delivered by the candidates to the respective Returning Officer between the hours of eight o'clock in the morning and one o'clock in the afternoon and between the hours of two o'clock and four o'clock in the afternoon at the place designated by the Commission.

- (j) Disputes relating to or arising from nominations shall be determined within ten (10) days of the lodging of the dispute with the Commission in any event not later than Thursday, 29th August, 2019.
- (k) The campaign period for purposes of the 17th October, 2019 by-election shall commence on Monday, 19th August, 2019 and cease on Monday, 14th October, 2019 being 48 hours before the by-election day.
- (l) The campaign time shall run from 7.00 a.m. to 6.00 p.m. during the campaign period.
- (m) Political parties and independent candidates shall appoint and submit to the Commission the names of their Constituency Elections Agents to the Commission on or before Wednesday, 2nd October, 2019.
- (n) The registration and revision of the register of voters for the said electoral areas is suspended until Monday, 4th November 2019.
- (o) If the by-elections are contested, the poll will take place on the Thursday, 17th October, 2019.

NOTES

1. The attention of candidates and persons subscribing nomination papers is drawn to the provisions of Parts III, VIII and IX of the Election (General) Regulations, section 13 (2) and the First Schedule to the Leadership and Integrity Act (No. 19 of 2012) and Chapter Six of the Constitution of Kenya.
2. Every political party, candidate and every person who participates in the election shall subscribe to and observe the Electoral Code of Conduct set out in the Second Schedule to the Elections Act, 2011.
3. A person guilty of an election offence will be liable to the penalties imposed by the Election Offences Act, 2016 (No. 37 of 2016), the disqualifications imposed thereof and the Constitution of Kenya.
4. The attention of candidates and political parties is drawn to the provisions of section 43 (5A) of the Elections Act, 2011.
5. The attention of candidates is drawn to the provisions of section 26 of the Elections Act, 2011.
6. The attention of political parties, candidates and every person who participates in the election is drawn to section 2 of the Elections Act, 2011 on the campaign period.
